Help Support Hartford-Area Nonprofits' Earned Income Ventures

Since 2019, 24 Hartford-area nonprofits have participated in the Hartford Foundation's Social Enterprise Accelerator (SEA), a 30-month process to strengthen their entrepreneurial capacity by launching or growing revenue generating ventures that are mission-aligned.

- Send flowers to someone in Greater Hartford through Persimmon Petals, YWCA Hartford Region's florist shop
- Give someone a unique gift for the holidays or a birthday from Harc's SockStarz or Noah Webster House's The West Hartford Gift Shop
- Need a unique venue for an upcoming event? Try Chrysalis Center's La Cocina and Training & Conference Center (TCC), Camp Courant's Pavilions at Camp Courant, or The Conference of Churches' The 224 Ecospace.
- Use catering services from Chrysalis Center's La Cocina Catering. Though not part of SEA, Fire by Forge and Hands on Hartford's Gather 55 also offer catering services.

NSP's Technology Grant Program Can Help Smaller Nonprofits

NSP's Small Technology Program is available to 501(c)3 organizations with annual budgets under \$300,000, located in the Hartford Foundation's 29-town region and aligned with the Foundation's strategic priorities. Your small nonprofit will complete a brief online survey assessing your current technology systems and capacity. Your organization will then be matched with a consultant who will review your survey results and help you identify, budget and plan to implement one or two tech projects including: website, donor management system, staff training, hardware, cloud computing, phone system, cybersecurity, video conferencing. Grant funding may be available to assist with implementation.
