Teams from each of these organizations recently participated in four workshop sessions and miniconsultations to help them explore possibilities to launch or grow an entrepreneurial revenue-generating venture aimed at boosting their income and mission impact.

They will now embark on a 30-month process to develop and implement business plans, with the guidance of No Margin, No Mission, a national consulting firm that helps nonprofits become stronger and more vibrant through earned income, social enterprise, and entrepreneurial practices.
